SALE OF CHAMETZ (Mechirat Chametz)

The disposal of leaven (chametz) before the start of the Passover holiday traditionally requires not only the removal or storing of all chametz, but also its dispossession. Traditional Jewish law states that we are not even allowed to own any chametz during the entire Passover holiday. Therefore, to enable us to fulfill these traditional requirements, Jewish law provides for a technical procedure whereby we can sell all chametz in our possession for the duration of the holiday. This is known as "mechirat chametz" ("sale of chametz"). If you wish to take part in this tradition, please complete the form below and submit it so that it is received by Tuesday, March 28, 2023. (Note: The early deadline is because Rabbi David will be on vacation the week immediately preceding the start of Passover.)

It is traditional to make a special tzedakah donation called "ma'ot chittim" ("wheat money") when selling one's chametz. Therefore, please consider making a donation to MAZON: A JEWISH RESPONSE TO HUNGER when submitting the authorization form below. You can do so by visiting their website www.mazon.org or by enclosing a check to "Mazon" which Temple Israel can forward to that organization on your behalf. Also, you may wish to donate some or all of your unopened, non-perishable chametz items to the CHUM Food Shelf by placing these items in the shopping cart located on the lower level of the Temple (but no later than two days before the start of Passover please.)
